The events in the village that led up to Remembrance Sunday's service at the cenotaph have been phenomenal.

Commemorative services were held throughout the year in



and around Solva, remembering those lost in battle. Exhibitions were staged simultaneously to bring to life the events that occurred a hundred years ago. Finally on Saturday 10 November groups, societies, clubs and individuals created a special event in the Memorial Hall with drama, music and poetry to demonstrate that Solva did indeed remember. Solva Memorial Hall - Update

Solva Memorial Hall was built in 1812 as a Wesleyan Methodist Chapel - the second non-conformist place of worship in Solva, after Zion Chapel (Capel Ucha') in 1798. Many more followed: the Calvinistic Methodist Chapel in 1815; the Baptist (Capel Bach) in 1816; Mount Pleasant in 1864; and finally Capel y Cwm in 1887. Prior to this, records show there had been a Vicar in Whitchurch since 1351, which is where the inhabitants of Solva would have worshipped. The village grew, its population increased and St Aidans church opened in 1879 in Solva as a “chapel of ease”. The Wesleyan Methodist chapel became a British school, which eventually merged with the national school, located above the memorial cross, but the additional places of worship plus the moving of the school meant that it struggled in the 1890s and eventually closed in 1903. After WW1 monies were raised for a Memorial Hall. In 1921 foundation stones were laid for a rear extension (Main Hall) of the Wesleyan Methodist Chapel and it opened in 1922. Today Solva Memorial Hall is busy and active, catering for a host of activities in the village. It can be hired for both private and commercial functions: wedding receptions, dinner dances, parties, concerts, meetings, training and conferences, community events, art classes, exhibitions, fashion shows, dances, fitness classes and stage / cinema productions. 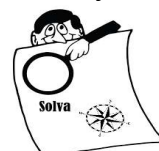


Capel Ucha

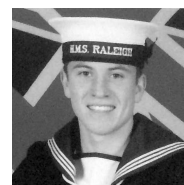

St Davids & Solva Surgeries NHS Wales Awards 2018

In June 2017, St. Davids Surgery and Solva Surgery began co-piloting a Health Board study to introduce Multi-Disciplinary Team meetings (MDTs) within Practices, with the aim of providing quicker, more holistic and better co-ordinated care. Hywel Dda University Health Board nominated the pilot for an NHS Wales Award 2018 in the 'Working Seamlessly Across Organisations' category – it was shortlisted to the final 3 out of over 70 nominations in this category, and a group of representatives from the various disciplines attended the Awards ceremony in Cardiff in September 2018. Since the end of the pilot study, both Practices have continued the MDT meetings, having seen the benefit to their patients of this way of working.
