Solva Precept Pressure

Once again the primary focus for last year was the devolution of non-statutory services as a result of the continuing budget restrictions within Pembrokeshire County Council. Solva Community Council is already paying PCC for delivery of Youth Services at an annual cost of £3,155 - otherwise this service would have been lost!

Climate Change Emergency

We believe that Solva Community Council is the first community/town council in Pembrokeshire to declare a #ClimateEmergency - following Welsh Government and Westminster's declarations. We must act now and we will:



- Pledge to do what is within our powers to make Solva carbon neutral by 2030;
- Call on Welsh Government to provide the powers and resources necessary for Solva to achieve target;
- Address how individuals, families, organisations and businesses understand local and global challenges;
- Develop a community-led Action Plan to reduce Solva's carbon emissions to net zero by 2030;
- Report within six months with that Action Plan, outlining the leadership role Solva Community Council will take to achieve this Carbon Neutral Commitment;
- Ask PCC and the Welsh government for help to bring this plan to fruition;
- Investigate all possible sources of external funding and match funding to support this commitment.

Solva Community Council AGM

This year the AGM placed a distinct emphasis on children's involvement. The first half of the session was given over to a consultation where local children were given the opportunity to voice their opinions on the proposals for both the upper and lower play parks. The main part of the AGM was given over to hearing reports on the community council's various activities over the year, summarised by Chair, Josh Phillips. We also had a presentation from the Head of Ysgol Penrhyn Dewi who emphasised the importance of Solva school as part of the educational delivery for the north Pembrokeshire peninsula. School Numbers were projected to increase but some voluntary redundancies would be unavoidable because of tight budgets. Mark Carter, our County Councillor, undertook to chase up progress on the projected development of the football field. Ifor Thomas outlined the benefits of carrying out the project as a Community Land Trust, which would mean the community would own the housing in perpetuity and also gain income. The meeting was enthusiastic in supporting this initiative. A long meeting concluded with light refreshments ably provided by Wendy Wright.



St Davids Church Whitchurch

Last year the Community Council clarified its maintenance responsibility for the old graveyard with the Church of Wales. Deeds were reviewed and they confirmed the ancient burial ground was transferred by the Welsh Church Commissioners to the Parish Council of Whitchurch (Solva) on 12 December 1927.

The community council has now allocated an annual budget of £500 for urgent work in the old graveyard – this will be overseen by a community council sub-committee headed by Joe Griffin.

A HUGE thank you to Mayor Mike Chant and the virtuoso artists who performed at the Mayor's Concert in St Davids Cathedral on the evening of 26 April. Bin Bags

As of 1 June 2019 when visiting the Waste & Recycling Centres (WRC) all bagged materials will be opened and checked to show they do not contain any recycling items. Only non-recyclable items will be allowed in the general waste skip.

Did you know that over 40% of waste thrown in the general waste container at our WRC could have been either recycled or reused? Pembrokeshire Council needs to increase the amount that we recycle to meet Welsh Government targets. If we miss these targets, we will be fined. Together the community-based Refill Schemes have put thousands of Refill Stations on the map, working in their local community and helping to stop millions of plastic bottles at source.



PCC Recovery of Community Council Election Costs

PCC confirmed in 2018 that SCC must raise sufficient funds to pay for the 2022 Elections and any By-Elections from April 2018. This applies to all other Town and Community Councils. The actual Cost for Solva Community Council in the contested May 2017 local elections was £4,374.90. SCC aims to raise £5,000 by April 2022. In addition, PCC wishes to seek SCC support for other non-statutory services which otherwise might be at risk of being withdrawn. These include:

- Public toilets in the lower car park
- The provision of Public Liability Insurance for the Playparks in Lower and Upper Solva
- Grounds Maintenance of Public open spaces at:

A487 bank opposite St Aidans Church - War Memorial - Upper Solva Play area - Bro Dawel - Bryn Seion and Maes yr Eglwys. Discussions with PCC have already commenced with an aim of agreeing a sustainable way forward by March 2020.

Other devolution matters in 2018 have centred on the community council's decision to proceed with the freehold purchase from PCC of AFC land on which the club house and car park stand. The total capital purchase is £25,880.00. An Enhancing Pembrokeshire grant will cover 80% of the purchase price, and match funding raised by the Edge Festival, Solva AFC and the Community Council will cover the remaining 20%.



Shearwater Community Centre

The Refurbishment of the Solva AFC suffered a set back when, despite being short listed, it failed to win funding under the Community Learning Hub Scheme. It seems therefore, an appropriate time to step back and reconsider how to take forward the Shearwater project. We still have planning permission for refurbishment and a small extension but perhaps this is not the best way forward for the community. It's been decided to get a small committee together to reappraise the project. Is it too ambitious or is it perhaps, not ambitious enough? Solva Rowing Club

More than 20 boats – and well over 100 people took part in the Ramsey Island Rowing Race, organised by Solva Rowing and Watersports Club on May 18. The 8-mile route takes in Ramsey Sound, with its notorious Bitches rocks, through a gap wide enough for one boat only, and around the western face of the island exposed to open sea. With potentially treacherous waters, the race can be staged only when suitable weather and tides converge, and three attempts to hold it in 2018 were foiled by storms.

This year the forecast was good...and the weather even better.

The field included 19 Celtic Longboats, a single scull, a double yole and three skis. The winners completed the course in 1 hour and 10 minutes - full results below. There was just 23 minutes separating the first and last boats.



The chairman of Solva Rowing and Watersports Club, Steve Probert, said the event couldn't have gone ahead without the support and contributions of so many people: the safety boat drivers and crews - Derek Rees, Steve Rees, Mark Youde, Peter Sephton and Dan Dafforn; the RNLI lifeguards; Porth Mawr Surf Lifesavers; Whitesands Beach House and the city council in St Davids.
