St Davids Church - Whitchurch

It has been brought to the attention of SCC that the church is in a sad state of disrepair, in particular the roof, and the building suffers from damp, has no heating, electricity or toilets. It should be a valued community asset, used not only for normal church services but also for community events such as concerts,

historic talks etc. Much work and money is needed to transform the church into a warm and welcoming place, but the initial challenge is to secure funds for general repairs. The SCC Chair is in the process of contacting the Diocesan Office to raise concerns about the decaying state of the church and request that immediate repair funds be allocated. The meeting on Thursday 11 April was preceded by a delicious shared lunch provided by the members. In the absence of the President, the meeting was chaired by one of the Vice Presidents, June Higgins, who welcomed everyone - including a returning visitor - and thanked the members for the food contributions.

Items discussed included the Dewisland Group Spring meeting and the PFWI Annual Quiz both having been attended by members and enjoyed. Future dates include the 2019 Annual Meeting and the Spring Council Meeting on Saturday 11 May.

The talk by Dr Sam Langdon on "Adders are Amazing" was considered brilliant. She told us about the worrying decline in the adder population and how this is an indication of the general decline in native wildlife. She encouraged us to keep dogs on leads on the coast path and to leave our stone hedge banks unscathed. She also pointed out that although adders have had a bad PR, there have been far fewer deaths from adder bites in the UK than other causes such as road accidents. They are shy creatures and are not aggressive unless frightened.

Our next meeting will be on Thursday 9 May at 2pm when we welcome back Sheena Crossley, who will entertain us (as ever!) with an illustrated talk on "Gardening with Herbs".

Pembrokeshire Herald 31 December 1869

"Solva – As briefly noted in our last Number, the Institution has formed a lifeboat station at Solva, Pembrokeshire, for service on the south side of St David's Head and in St Bride's Bay. It is a rock bound coast, but a good crew can always be secured there for a lifeboat, and one has been sent in the hope that it may be of service in the event of any shipwrecks occurring in that locality in future. Like the St Justinian Lifeboat Establishment, this station will be under the management of the Committee of the St David's branch of the Institution.

The boat provided is one of the 10 oared 33 feet class, and for it a house is being erected on ground granted by the Elder Brethren of the Trinity House. The entire expense of the lifeboat establishment is a gift to the Institution of a benevolent lady, in memory of her deceased husband, who had been for many years an active and esteemed Member of the Committee of management of the Institution; the boat is named Charles and Margaret. It was publicly inaugurated at Solva on the 11th September, being named by Miss Williams before being launched to exercise the crew. The boat had been towed to its station by the Trinity steamer. It had to encounter a heavy sea, particularly in the "tide race", but towed very well, shipping but little water in the passage". - The Lifeboat.


