voluntary charity, founded in 1991, to help to protect, conserve and enhance the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park for all who live, work or visit here, to enjoy both now and in the future.

They are founding members of the Alliance for Welsh Designated Landscapes and the Welsh National Park Societies and also work with other groups who seek to conserve our countryside. They assist other worthwhile projects such as the restoration and running of the Pump house at St Brides. They also provide small grants for organisations working with young people for projects related to the Park and are co-ordinating the planting of thousands of new trees. They run events throughout the year: guided walks, illustrated talks and visits – which are frequently open to non-members.

Repeat Prescription Requests

We require at least 48 hours notice to process orders for repeat prescriptions. If possible, you should re-order medication at least one week before you run out. **Please ring the prescription line only.** Repeat prescriptions (items that are on your re-order slip) may be requested:

- Online 24/7 by using our new service My Health Online (Ring Reception for a registration form)
- By telephone Repeat Prescription number is 01437 720644
- Hand deliver post your prescription re-order slip in the box provided by the front entrance.
- By post please tick the items you require. A stamped addressed envelope will be required for script only requests

Any requests for routine Repeat Prescriptions made after 3 pm on Thursday 1 April, will not be ready for collection until after 3 pm on Thursday 8 April.

Vaccine update

We have been informed by the Hywel Dda Health Board to start the roll—out of the 2nd vaccine (Oxford Astra Zeneca) to Cohort 2 (all those 80 years or age and over) from week 11 onwards, following their first dose. Therefore, we hope to be contacting this group soon. PLEASE DO NOT RING THE SURGERY. We are also getting a high number of calls from patients asking why their husband/wife/neighbour etc are being called for their second vaccine and they haven't. This is because those patients in Cohort 3 (aged 75-79) attended a mass vaccination centre for their first dose of the Pfizer-BioNtech, and can expect to be contacted soon for their second dose. The schedule for the second dose interval for the Pfizer-BioNtech DIFFERS from the Oxford-Astra Zeneca and is administered before 12 weeks. Please do not contact the surgery regarding this as we are unable to give you any further information. In the meantime if you or someone you know in group 1-6 has not been vaccinated please get in touch as soon as possible.

"A wandering Walrus I"

A far-wandering walrus, who made headlines in western Ireland recently, has come even closer to home, being spotted in south Pembrokeshire on Saturday 20 March. The rare marine mammal recently wowed astounded onlookers during its visit to the coast of County Kerry, and did the same at an undisclosed south Pembrokeshire beach.



It is believed the walrus, possibly the first recorded in Pembrokeshire, may have come so far south from its usual home after a snooze on a floating iceberg. The Welsh Marine Life Rescue, has so far rescued 62 seals, one baby otter, three dolphins, and is now monitoring a walrus!

The last day to complete the Census online is Tuesday 4 May, but people will still have an opportunity after this date to complete if necessary.

Every household should have received the letter inviting them to take part and we've had a great response so far. If you haven't responded, or have misplaced your letter, head online to www.census.gov.uk and request a new unique access code.

There is plenty of help available, including face-to-face assistance at local Census Support Centres. The ONS will never share personal details and no-one, including government bodies, will be able to identify you in census statistics. Personal census records will be kept secure for 100 years, and only then can future generations view them.

RHS Top Gardening tips for April

Expect the inevitable April showers this month but with sunny days too, when you can turn your attention to the lawn. It's an exciting month, with indoor-sown seeds well into growth, and it's also time to start sowing outdoors. Just watch out for frosts.

- Keep weeds under control
- Protect fruit blossom from late frosts
- Tie in climbing and rambling roses
- Sow hardy annuals, herbs and wild flower seed outdoors
- Increase the water given to houseplants
- Feed hungry shrubs and roses
- Sow new lawns or repair bare patches


Shalom House

Solva Amateur Football Club - Solva says goodbye to one of its colourful characters

David Henry Llewellyn Evans (Dai), affectionately known as Dai the Bomb, passed away peacefully on 11

February 2021 aged 83, having been involved with Solva AFC from the early 1970s though to the 1990s and an active member of the community for much of his life. It is for his involvement with Solva AFC that he will be most fondly remembered by many, as well as being an elected parish Councillor. He was known to raise thousands of pounds for Solva AFC through selling weekly Tote tickets.



His most cherished contribution to Solva AFC began with his stewardship of the u15s team in 1971. Dai was not a football coach or manager but more a facilitator. Those early teams formed the nucleus of what would become the team to make it to the final of the West Wales Youth Cup in 1974, coming up against none other than Swansea City!

There are very few characters like Dai left and as times have changed it is unlikely there will be again. His passion for his work, his community and his local football club revolved around his love for talking to people! Dai's contribution to the Solva community will not be forgotten, and plans to install a bench in his honour at Solva AFC are already in motion. (Dai pictured far right, above)
