


Multi Generational Path

SOLVA WI

We met in the Hall on Thursday 10th February. The speaker, Gareth Mills from the Pembroke Dock Heritage Centre started the meeting and held our attention totally. His talk and slide show on 'GI Brides' covered a far greater area including the influx of US troops all over the South Wales coast practising for D-Day. The largest American contingent to come to Pembrokeshire was the 110th Regiment of the 28th US Infantry Division (known as the Keystone Division). Out of some 17,000 men who landed in Newport, Monmouthshire in October 1943, over 2000 GI's arrived at Pembroke Dock railway station at the dead of night. A number of residents awoke in the night fearing that the German Invasion had started! Thousands of these young soldiers from the 110th Regiment died between November 1944 and January 1945 in two of the bloodiest battles of the war, the Hürtgen Forest for the Siegfried Line, and the Battle of the Bulge in Ardennes. Sadly, for so many of these GIs, the towns and villages of Pembrokeshire and their inhabitants, were the last friendly people and places they would know. The next exhibition, due to open midway through 2022, will be the story of the building of the Millennium Falcon – a must for fans of Star Wars!

The business meeting then followed – Matters discussed included what had been, until Covid restrictions, the annual event of a fundraising Pancake Coffee morning. After some discussion, it was decided to go ahead with it this year especially as it falls on St Davids Day. We request that you wear masks on entry and hand sanitise. WI members will take your order once you're seated and then bring it to you. Price £2.50 for coffee & pancake, extra pancakes 50p each. The local charity we are raising funds for is 'Get the boys a lift'.

Numbers for the trip to Cegin Gareth on 10th March were finalised.

Câr-Y-Môr News

Here at Câr-Y-Môr, we have secured two grants totalling £398,000 for the set up of our larger 3 hectare site!

The Decarbonisation and COVID Fund from Menter a Busnes and Welsh Government granted Car Y Mor £98,000 for help in training, labour, marine contractors and many other elements.

The European Maritime Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund also granted Câr-Y-Môr £300,000 for the setup of the commercial scale site based in Ramsey Sound. This funding will contribute to farm infrastructure, shellfish and seaweed seed material, and an innovative work barge.

This is a significant development in the timeline of Câr-Y-Môr, which was registered in 2019, but we are still open for member investment.

PLEASE SHARE WIDELY as Câr-Y-Môr still requires funding for the construction of St David's Seafood House and educational space, as well as the creation of our Regenerative Ocean Farm Training course. Both crucial to fulfil our societies goals, and to contribute to

combating our humanities multiple emergencies of health, climate and biodiversity.

We are still waiting for the results from our application about our larger, 3 hectare farm. Watch this space! If you have any questions or concerns, please email dan@carymor.wales. Prendergast parking

Concerns have been raised to me as County Councillor in respect of traffic congestion in Prendergast outside Ty Mawr. The worst scenario last summer was when an ambulance failed to get to a sick resident due to bad parking. The problem appears to originate from badly parked vehicles, almost certainly visitors to Solva, alongside the newly built stone building. There is one spot by the square post outside Ty Mawr that if someone parks opposite it will prevent anything other than the smallest car passing.

The suggestion is that double yellow lines be requested outside the new stone building or even a seasonal parking restriction. Solva Community Council and myself would like feedback from residents as to how much of a problem this is perceived to be and what they think is best to do, and whether they agree with further parking restrictions in that area. Newgale Coastal Adaptations

Could you be impacted by the Newgale Coastal Adaptation? Do you have an interest in the effects of climate change locally and how we adapt to them?

This is your chance to get involved.

The Newgale Coastal Adaptation encompasses all adaptation work at Newgale, including the replacement road. Pembrokeshire Coastal Forum are supporting Pembrokeshire County Council and Atkins to organise 'Task and Finish Groups' (TFGs) to help influence decisions about Newgale – and we want your views on what is important.

We are looking for people to join the six planned TFGs:

1.Active Travel and Coast Path / 2.Infrastructure / 3.Business Resilience / 4.Beach Safety and User Access / 5.Natural Environment / 6.Replacement Road

TFGs will be small, focussed groups so that discussions and ideas can take place easily. We would expect people who are most likely to be affected by the topic of the TFG to want to be involved. Members of TFGs will need to think about the wishes and needs of others, including those who are not part of the TFG.

The TFGs are likely to run from April onwards, with 3 x 2 hour sessions for each topic. It's likely that these sessions will take place online. The architect has already been appointed and soon the community will be involved in shaping the proposals. Jamie King, a son of Solva, has led the briefing process using his experience as a director in his own multi-national architectural practice. So the CLT is a knowledgeable client who can get the best out of the design team in terms of sustainable design whilst coming up with an aesthetically pleasing concept. Ateb the not-for-profit housing association will manage the detail as our partners on the project. To make sure that you have your say be a member of the CLGT, it only costs one pound. Withybush hospital open letter

Dear Eluned Morgan, I am writing to you on behalf of Solva Community Council in relation to the rumoured plans to 'downgrade' Withybush hospital.

As a community we are concerned regarding the variety of rumours and speculation that surround Withybush at this time and would like to seek some clarification as to the position of Withybush at present and in the future.

As you will be aware Solva is reliant on Withybush and benefits from having a hospital in such close proximity particularly in times of emergency. We are concerned that any 'downgrading' would leave residents on the peninsular in a vulnerable position. With an aging population, a thriving tourism industry boosting population numbers in the summer and intermittent access issues at Newgale it is vital that some level of critical care is maintained at Withybush.

The situation in Pembrokeshire is very febrile and Withybush has been at the centre of speculation around its provision for a number of years. It is a highly emotive issue and we as a community council are seeking clarification on this issue to be able to reassure our local residents.

We are aware of a number of consultations that have already taken place around healthcare provision in west Wales and would like to better understand what processes have taken place so far and will take place prior to any final decision being made? Will further consultation take place with the people of Pembrokeshire prior to any final decision. What works are being done to enhance existing services at Withybush? What is the long term vision for the provision of health and social care at Withybush and for Pembrokeshire? The pandemic has shown us that location should not be a barrier to accessing services in particular via digital methods, how is this layer of provision being explored as a means for future health provision? What steps are being made to ensure that any deficits in rural infrastructure will not disadvantage people in our communities. In the past recruitment and retention of staff at Withybush have presented significant challenges, what is being done to recruit and encourage staff to work here. Do you agree that the provision of Accident and Emergency at Withybush is vital and must be maintained to ensure that residents of our peninsular and rural Pembrokeshire have access to these emergency services.

I thank you for taking the time to answer these questions and I look forward to sharing in a productive dialogue with you. Support for health and well-being of our residents is paramount to the members of our Council.

Appointments - The surgery continues to operate a full telephone triage service. If you have a medical query and would like to speak to a Doctor or Nurse please telephone the surgery on 01437 721306

PLEASE WEAR A MASK - Patients are still required to wear a mask when attending the surgery, whether it's for an appointment or to collect a prescription.

Coronavirus symptoms - Please do not attend the surgery for an appointment if you have any cold-like symptoms, including a temperature, a new continuous cough, a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste. Or if you have been in contact with someone who has had a positive PCR result or if a member of your household has tested positive for COVID-19. This is not only to protect our workforce but to protect other patients. Dispensary/Reception opening Hours – Our Dispensary and Reception Desk is closed between the hours of 1pm and 2pm. Telephone lines will remain open. In an emergency please telephone 01437 721306.

Prescription Collection – 2.00pm to 5.30pm, Monday to Friday. Please note that we require at least 48 hours to process orders for repeat prescriptions, and we kindly ask that patients re-order medication at least one week before they are due to run out. **Flu Vaccination** – Are you a patient aged 50 years and older (age on 31/03/22) or aged 6months – 49 years in a clinical risk group (have a respiratory disease, heart disease, kidney disease, liver disease, diabetes, morbid obesity) and yet to have your flu vaccination, then please contact the surgery to arrange an appointment, we have limited stock left.

Ear syringing – Unfortunately we no longer offer this service at the practice. The Local Health Board are finalising plans to implement an Ear Syringing Service for all practices in Pembrokeshire. However, due to the ongoing pandemic, lack of resources and staff shortages, there has been a delay in doing this but hopefully the service will be up and running in the next few weeks. In the meantime there are various establishments in Pembrokeshire that provide this service privately. Please contact us and we would be happy to give you a contact number.

Easter Opening Hours – Solva Surgery will be closed over the Easter Bank Holiday including Friday 15th and Monday 18th April.

We really appreciate your understanding during these difficult times and would like to thank you in advance for your co-operation.
