

Men's sheds were originally founded in 2013 in response to a need for a central body to represent and raise awareness of a small, but growing number of Men's Sheds. Back then there were just 30 Men's Sheds in the UK. In 2015 we became a registered charity with a view to providing more formal support to the Men's Shed movement. Fast forward to today and there are over 600 all inclusive Peoples's Sheds open and an additional 150 or more in planning at any one time. That's around 13,000 or more Shedders, as we call them, benefiting from regular social interactions, new and improved skills, and regular, active participation in activities they enjoy.

The rate of growth of People's Sheds is between six and nine a month. People are starting to enjoy our wood and metal work shop. Come and join in the fun --- or just drop in for a sit down with tea or coffee and a look at things. Anyone from Solva is welcome to join. We have many tools that you may only want to use once in a blue moon and don't justify buying but with expert advice you can use them at the peoples's shed.

Of course, as you probably know, the Scout Hut was built by our community years ago by public subscription. Many people "bought" bricks to contribute to the fund-raising Let's get the hut/shed going again. It is a community centre in itself, just right for children's parties, play groups, art clubs, and so on.

Come and join the volunteers, who are helping to resurrect it, or just come and enjoy it!

In March, we received confirmation from NRW that we have a marine licence for a 3ha farm in Ramsey Sound. This spring, we will start putting in place the anchors and lines for our new farm. On the new site, we will be growing sugar kelp, oarweed, native oysters, scallops, and mussels. From putting in this new farm, not only will we be producing good quality, local seafood, enhancing the local environment, but it will also create new jobs in the process. Seafood processors will be needed, as well as a farm manager. Keep an eye out for vacancies!

Coast Allotment Project

Born from the lack of allotment spaces in Solva, I decided to offer up the parcel of land I rent to be used as community garden. Along with friends and other residents we formed a Management committee and created COAST - Community Organised Allotments for Solva Tenants. The aim is to provide a space for growing, teaching & wildlife in a carbon friendly way.


We're creating up to a dozen micro plots that will be available on an annual basis, a wildlife garden with recreational seating & a community shed that will available for groups to use as a workshop space, come lending library for gardening books and as a place to shelter when the weathers not great! with Solar panels for light and rain water collection system.

There will also be a plot given up for the local primary school which will be where we can teach the younger generations on the importance of sustainability and how we can help the environment with our actions working alongside Non, Aiden & Dewi Campuses. Lastly a community compost area that will be open for all residents to deposit green waste and collect compost. We secured funding from The National Lottery Community Fund, Solva Care, Tesco Haverfordwest (Blue tokens) and The sustainable development fund part of Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority all of whom saw our vision and thought it was a fantastic community benefiting idea. Without this funding we wouldn't be able to do this project, it also means we don't need additional funds from Solva community council or Pembrokeshire County council. We hope once completed the site will be self sustaining and as its off grid carbon friendly as well. We've got 200+ trees ready to plant across Solva in November and by then we're hoping the site will be completed and ready to welcome visitors. Unfortunately due to issues that were created as a result of COVID and beyond our control we are behind schedule, thankfully though things are moving and mid October 2022 is our target end date. The site is fully insured and we are now actively seeking volunteers to help with the transformation, if you'd like to help drop us an email at coastsolva@gmail.com or message our Facebook page. We're also happy to accept donations of old tools, gardening books etc as well. We hope once completed, other villages across Pembrokeshire see what can be achieved on a small scale and replicate our project by enhancing Pembrokeshire one village at a time.


