#### Solva Surgery - What does the Future Hold?

Over one hundred people attended the public event convened by Solva Community council to consider the news that the current GP, Dr Sujan, of Solva Surgery was retiring at the end of March. The meeting was opened by the Chair of the Community Council, Ifor Thomas, and chaired by Sue Denman. She stressed that at this time there was no indication that the Hywel Dda Health Board intended to close the surgery, but the retirement of Dr Sujan, did create an opportunity for those that were registered to the practice to consider how they wanted the work of the surgery to continue into the future.

The meeting split into smaller groups and considered what they thought of the way that the surgery had worked up until now and then discussion revolved around how they saw the future. The groups fed back in a public session. By and large there was general satisfaction with the way the surgery had operated to date with one group summarising the attitude of the surgery staff as epitomised by kindness, understanding and availability.' Thoughts did turn to the future with an overwhelming desire to see the work of the surgery continue and even expand into other areas of care. The impending loss of the dispensary was universally regretted.

A working group has been formed to engage with the Health Board to determine the way forward and ensure that the needs of Solva and the outlying areas are met.

#### **County Councillor update**

Hello all, I hope you are warm and well.

I want to clarify this month the position in respect of the toilets at Solva Harbour Car Park. As most residents will know, Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority controls the running of the car park and collects the income . Pembrokeshire County Council runs the toilets sited there and pays for that service. The public toilets in Pembrokeshire are not a statutory service , PCC are not obliged to provide them but up to now , have possibly the greatest number of public toilets in any Welsh County. Some toilets have an income stream by either having a barrier "pay on use" system as seen in Tenby or by receiving money from associated car park income. There is only one toilet block in Pembrokeshire that nearly covers its costs by the barrier system and is next to the multi storey car park in Tenby. PCC have invited all Town and Community Councils that have a toilet block without income stream to take over the funding of the running of that toilet block as part of suggested budget cuts.

In the case of Solva, if it was a PCC car park, then the toilets would be funded by the car park charges, but it's PCNPA that collects the car park fees so Solva toilets have no income stream and hence COULD POSSIBLY be at risk of closure in the worst case future scenario. Negotiations have taken place and PCNPA have been invited to contribute to the 17 or so PCC toilets that are situated in a PCNPA car park but no agreement has been reached as yet.

PCC advised Solva CC that for PCC to run the toilets on behalf of Solva CC, then the cost would be just over £12,000. In my view this would mean Solva residents having a 33% increase in the SCC precept to provide a service for visitors to a PCNPA car park, which I think is totally unfair. My hope is that PCNPA will see reason and agree to making a substantial or total contribution to the running of these toilets. However it must be stressed that the PCC budget will not be finalised until early March 2023 so it is extremely unlikely that any change to the provision of toilets in Solva will take place in the next financial year.

Secondly residents should be aware that PCNPA have doubled the price of Car Park Season tickets for the coming season making a seasonal price for Solva car park now £50. Again this is a PCNPA decision.

Finally please could residents keep an eye out for non working street lights and either report on my account or text me on 07976 553912, the number and location of the faulty light. All PCC street lights have a 6 digit identity number on them 3 digits going across and 3 digits down. If the faulty light is on a Pembrokeshire Housing association estate and does not have a number on it, then it needs to be reported to the Housing Association As always if you have any concerns regarding Council matters, please contact me on 07976 553912 or email cllr.mark.carter@pembrokeshire.gov.uk, best regards Mark.

#### Pembrokeshire FRAME - Advice

Pembrokeshire Frame's community fuel advice coordinator, Frank Farrer and volunteer community champions have spent their time researching the issues and several solutions on how we can hopefully save money to become energy smart.



Here are our top ten tips on how to be energy smart

- Learn to read your meters and give your supplier regular readings to avoid estimated bills
- Understand what tariff you are on and what your energy costs.
- Understand how to correctly use your heating controls and timers.
- Turn off appliances when not in use and avoid using stand-by long term as this will waste energy.
- Use a slow cooker and microwave as both are very efficient ways to save electricity when making meals
- Shower and keep in short between 5-7 minutes if in doubt use a timer. Average energy saving of around £207 a year.
- Dress appropriately for the weather, thin layers are best.
- Only boil the water you need in your kettle. This can save you around £6 a year.
- Go draught hunting, draught-proofing can cut 2% off energy bills, so about £50 a year on average for a typical home.
- Using your washing machine wisely, lower temperature and no more small loads and wash at night, if possible, by using a timer or delayed start function.

Along with these tips we can help you check you are receiving the benefits your entitled to by doing Benefits checks and give advice on maximising your income, give advice on basic household budgeting, We can request an issue electricity vouchers for those in greatest need on prepaid meters, we can assist in applications.

If you are over 60 years old, have a child under 5 in your household, live with a disability or have sight or hearing loss you would qualify for being on the Priority Services Register from the utility companies for gas electricity and water. It is a scheme where you are treated as a priority when there are issues your connection to their services and security if you must have a visit from one of their engineers.

With our partnership connections we can connect you with NEST and give advice on special tariffs of Dwr Cymru and work closely with Cwm Arian who can offer heat loss surveys.


