COUNCILLERS CORNER

The first half of May has seen 3 important all member Council meetings take place at County Hall. Firstly on Thursday 11th May, Full council took place. The agenda items were somewhat run of the mill but there was a raft of questions put forward for public answers. I asked questions about the failure of PCC to advise their tenants of the impending rent increases within the 2 month statutory notice period. The letters were sent by an outside contractor and were dated 25th January but did not arrive with many tenants until the end of March. This prevented a 1st April rent increase and has prevented a rent increase commencing until 1st July. This has lost the Council £380,000. I look forward to see how this can be recovered

Next day was the AGM of Pembrokeshire County Council which saw Cllr Thomas Tudor installed as Chairman of the Council and Cllr Steve Alderman installed as Vice Chairman. Most other chairs and vice chairs remained with the existing councillors.

On the 18th May, an Extraordinary meeting was held to consider the Notice of no confidence in the Leader David Simpson. There were numerous speakers and the motion fell in the end with 29 members against the Leader and 31 in support. I voted in favour of a change of Leader and Cllr Simpson now has another year in office.

On a different topic, it has been reported that a member of the National Trust parked in the Harbour car park and received a fixed penalty notice for failure to pay and display a ticket. Having checked, the advice is that members of the National trust can park anywhere in the Harbour Car park as long as a valid up to date membership card is displayed clearly in the car window. If you feel you have wrongly received a fixed penalty, then please challenge the ticket by referring to the rear of the ticket on your windscreen.

SAVE SOLVA SURGERY - WORKING GROUP

The meeting with the Regional Health Board (HDUHB), on Solva Surgery, took place as planned on 25th April. The meeting was held in Solva Memorial Hall and was attended by 18 people, the majority of whom were HDUHB employees. HDUHB officials reported satisfaction overall with the transition to a managed practice. The rest of the meeting was spent by Solva Surgery Working Group representatives: Sue Denman, Gareth Chapman and Iain Robertson Steel emphasising the importance of Solva retaining General Practice for the village and how this could be achieved in a sustainable way. The Health Board has gone away to consider its response to our ideas and how best to go forward to keep momentum.

We will continue to meet as a large working group of some 14 members of the community, with a core group (see above, plus Ifor Thomas and Luci Chapman) involved in the detail.

It is important that we represent your wishes for the future of health and care in our community. We will continue to communicate via a monthly briefing to Solva Community Council as well as using our local websites, Facebook and newsletter. SOLVA SURGERY

Repeat Prescription requests and dispensing – As you are aware the dispensing of medication from the Surgery finished on 31st March 2023. This will mean that we have stopped ordering any more stock from our wholesalers and you will see a reduction in availability of prescription medications which can be dispensed by the Surgery. Please bear with us whilst we go through this transition period. You will be asked to take your paper prescription to a chemist.

All patients will have received a letter from Hywel Dda Health Board explaining how you get your medication.

If you have regular medication (called Repeat medication) you will still need to order this from the Surgery and the staff will produce a prescription which will need to be signed by the GP. You can either collect the signed prescription from the Surgery and then take it to any Community Pharmacy yourself for them to dispense it for you, or you can ask for all your signed prescriptions to be sent directly to a Community Pharmacy of your choice which may be more convenient. If you are prescribed a medication as a one-off, or not on a regular basis you can do the same.

To order your Repeat prescription

Please contact the Surgery to order your prescription 7-10 days before your medication is required.

Order your prescription via the same methods, either by phoning the repeat prescription line on 01437 720644, online or post your repeat slip directly to the surgery.

You can collect your prescription or nominate your chosen Pharmacy

Collect your prescription from the Surgery and take it yourself to a Community Pharmacy. Or ask the Surgery to send your prescriptions to one of the Pharmacies below that has a collection service and they will have the medication ready for you to pick-up 7-10 days after your order. Some Community Pharmacies offer home delivery of your medication. This is not an NHS service, is subject to delivery radius and delivery charges may apply.

Well Pharmacy - St Davids Boots Pharmacy - Fishguard Myrtle Pharmacy, Goodwick Boots Pharmacy - Haverfordwest Davies Pharmacy, Haverfordwest Well Pharmacy - Haverfordwest





If you want all of your prescriptions to go to one of the Community Pharmacies that offer this collection service, you can tell one of the reception team at the Surgery and they will note this in your records so that every prescription goes there directly, this means that you won't need to collect your prescription from the Surgery.

The Health Board is working with the Surgery and local Community Pharmacies to make this transition as easy as possible for patients, however we need your help in doing this by ensuring that you order any repeat medication 7-10 days in advance of when you need it, so you don't run out of any medication.


