COUNCILLERS CORNER

I write to say how delighted I am to have entered my 7th year as the elected PCC member for Solva. I thought I would just outline what this role entails.

Primarily I am the link between Pembrokeshire County Council and the 1215 people of Solva and Brawdy. I am here to answer residents' concerns and enquiries. This can vary from the mundane questions about littering and dog fouling to assisting residents with far more important and life improving issues.

All 60 Pembrokeshire County Councillors represent their residents and help to determine policy but 18 of those have more senior roles including myself. The basic requirement is that a County Councillor attends at least a meeting every 6 months and these are Full Council, Annual Council and when required Extraordinary Council. Then there are many other Committees that members sit on to ensure the smooth running and timely decisions of the Council.

As a more senior member I have 12 roles, in addition to the mentioned three, I am Chair of the Services Overview and Scrutiny Committee which examines the services that are supplied to the public, I sit on the Planning Committee, the Licencing Committee, where we determine licencing policy, and also the Licencing sub Committee which determines applications from the taxi and pub trade. I also sit on the Partnerships Panel which receives regular updates from the Police and other social providers and also the Disciplinary committee which deals with staff issues.

I am the reserve member on the Standards Committee and sit on the Council tax working group that makes recommendations on Council tax policy. Finally I am Deputy group Leader for the PCC Conservative Group and also a member of Brawdy Community Council.

I have to say that I enjoy the challenge of problem solving that residents ask me to get involved in and I have formed strong links with Officers in County Hall that can only benefit our community.

Overall the event of the past year that has given me the most pride to be part of in Solva is the annual Firework Display at the Harbour, the turnout was absolutely astounding and was clearly reflected in the bucket collection.

I thank all members of the Community of Solva for their support and in turn if you need help, please get in touch

ANOTHER BLOW TO OUR COMMUNITY

St David's looks set to lose its very last serving bank following this week's announcement that Lloyd's will be closing its branch in the city.

This week local MP Stephen Crabb requested an urgent meeting with Lloyds personnel when he questioned their senior management over their reasons for closing the last remaining bank in St Davids. During the meeting I was able to relay the concerns and the questions that have already been raised with me by a number of community councillors as well as customers who use the branch on a regular basis, he said:



"Sadly, there seems little chance of getting Lloyds to cancel or postpone the closure which is scheduled for November 27. Much of our discussion was therefore focused on what alternative arrangements and services will be available for their customers and the wider community."

This closure is sadly a sign of the times with so many other banking channels being used regularly, and conveniently, by customers. But nonetheless it is another empty high street premises whose fate is yet to be determined.

Our community has already lost two banks and all we will have left is the post office at Cks or Bayview Stores or alternatively it'll be a trip to Haverfordwest. The only cash point in St Davids will be the one at CK's which charges for withdrawals.



Travelling abroad and need travel vaccines?

Please note the Practice requires patients to complete and return a Travel Risk Assessment form (ask at Reception) **AT LEAST 6 WEEKS BEFORE TRAVEL.** This allows sufficient time for the Nursing Team to source the relevant vaccines, in the case of any stock shortages. It is also better to be vaccinated at least 6 weeks before travel to give your immune system time to respond to the vaccines. For late requests, the practice may not be able to administer all the vaccines you need, and you may have to contact one of the nearest Travel Clinics instead:

Please contact the Surgery to order your prescription

7 - 10 days before your medication is required. Order your prescription via the same methods, either by phoning the repeat prescription line on 01437 720644, online or post your repeat slip directly to the surgery.

Did you know that you can nominate your chosen Pharmacy?

You can ask the Surgery to send your prescriptions to one of the Pharmacies below that has a collection service and they will have the medication ready for you to pick-up 7-10 days after your order. Some Community Pharmacies offer home delivery of your medication. This is not an NHS service, is subject to delivery radius and delivery charges may apply.

Well Pharmacy - St Davids Myrtle Pharmacy, Goodwick Davies Pharmacy, Haverfordwest Boots Pharmacy - Fishguard Boots Pharmacy - Haverfordwest Well Pharmacy – Haverfordwest

If you want all of your prescriptions to go to one of the Community Pharmacies that offer the collection service, you can tell one of the reception team at the Surgery and they will note this in your records so that every prescription goes there directly, this means that you won't need to collect your prescription from the Surgery.


