COUNCILLORS CORNER

August is traditionally a quiet month in County Hall, with only essential meetings and many officers on annual leave so now is probably a good time to catch up on ongoing matters

Around this time of year I get calls about Highway verge mowing and the fact it seems to get later each year. PCC do have my sympathy in this case as many people are keen to preserve the wild hedgerow flowers so want the cutting to be delayed, but the motorist who uses the back roads has to contend with poor visibility as the grass hedges grow into the road. A later start also helps with budget pressures as only one cut is then required. There is also the bird nesting season to consider. So this year, the cutting season started later on 1st July and I made a request that the busiest back roads were prioritised as those get more safety benefit over cutting the main roads first.

Another ongoing matter in Haverfordwest is the demolition and replacement of the Multi Storey Car Park with a car park and transport interchange (Bus Station). As most people will be aware the original structure has been demolished but there have been delays in obtaining Grant Funding , and engaging a building contractor. The project is said to be funded 90% by grant and 10% by Pembrokeshire CC funds. As your elected member for Solva, I want to share my views with you. I have doubts as to whether this project will achieve the benefits and regeneration that are claimed for Haverfordwest and I would prefer to see a nice open space for events , the Farmers Market and the fair etc along side surface parking. Retail shopping habits have changed over the years and more so since Covid.. Out of town shopping and online shopping becoming the norm. A temporary car park has now been established on the site but the signage advertising it has been poor. It is also only possible to pay by the Pay By Phone App which is very good and valid for all Pembrokeshire Council operated car parks including Solva and other PCNPA car parks but does charge a small premium for using it. However once it is installed and set up on your smart phone, it is very easy to use.

On the subject of car parks please remember when using Solva Harbour Car park to ensure that your season ticket or National Trust membership pass is clearly visible as otherwise you will get a penalty notice

NEW ERA FOR STAFF AND PATIENTS AT SOLVA

Hywel Dda University Health Board, which has recently taken over the management of the Solva GP Surgery, has thanked staff and the local community for all their support and hard work as the practice enters a new phase.

Recent developments at the Pembrokeshire surgery include the appointment of a permanent GP along with new roles such as a Lead Nurse – and there are further plans to invest in the training and development of staff within the team in the near future.

The surgery, which is situated in the village of Solva, serves a population across the Peninsula and was taken over by the health board following an extensive public engagement exercise earlier this year. This was carried out after the surgery ended its General Medical Services (GMS) contract in March 2023.

Dr Angela Unversucht, who has been providing regular locum cover at the practice since August 2022, has now been appointed into a permanent role as the practice Clinical Lead GP.

Dr Unversucht said:

"I am delighted to have become the Clinical Lead GP at the Solva Surgery for the health board. It is a much-valued service for the registered patients across the Peninsula, and I am happy to be able to support our patients and the practice team including regular locums who are supporting me at Solva Surgery and are all experienced GPs. The practice is also in the process of recruiting more permanent doctors."

"Work has also been underway to bolster the practice nursing team," Dr Unversucht continued. "We have appointed a Lead Nurse who will be starting later this summer, an additional nurse for chronic disease monitoring and a new Health Care Support Worker. We will also be working with the North Pembrokeshire Cluster on a project for healthy lifestyles and disease prevention."

Services at Solva Surgery include GP face-to-face and telephone consultations which are available every day. Patients are able to book non-urgent appointments in advance.

Dr Unversucht said:

"The availability of appointments and clinics with the practice nursing team will be increasing in the coming weeks as the new staff commence in post and we look forward to being fully staffed in the nursing team."

Hywel Dda UHB is continuing to work with the Peninsula Working Group to discuss the longer-term sustainability of services across the Peninsula, with a further meeting planned in the coming weeks.

Under the new arrangements, Solva Surgery no longer has a dispensary for medication. The majority of patients are using the Well Community Pharmacy in St David's, which has seen a significant increase in the dispensing of medicines and has expanded the range of clinical services it offers. Work to improve the premises is taking place in the coming weeks.

Director of Primary Care Jill Paterson said that the health board had been working closely with patients, the local community in Solva and other partner agencies.

"We have been very pleased with the outcome so far," said Ms Paterson.

"I would like to thank the practice staff for working so hard through an uncertain time to deliver a smooth transition and to patients for their continuing support for the practice team."

Solva Quay is celebrating excellent water quality results recently recorded. On June 26 and July 6, 2023, samples were taken, showing E.coli levels at 97 cfu/100 ml and 64 cfu/100 ml, and Enterococci levels at 40 cfu/100 ml and 13 cfu/100 ml, respectively.

These outstanding results classify the water as "Excellent." The efforts of local authorities and stakeholders have contributed to maintaining a clean and safe environment for residents and visitors alike. Solva Quay's commitment to monitoring and preserving water quality sets a shining example for other coastal areas to follow.

Travelling abroad and need travel vaccines?

Please note the Practice requires patients to complete and return a Travel Risk Assessment form (ask at Reception) **AT LEAST 6 WEEKS BEFORE TRAVEL.**This allows sufficient time for the Nursing Team to source the relevant vaccines, in the case of any stock shortages. It is also better to be vaccinated at least 6 weeks before travel to give your immune system time to respond to the vaccines. For late requests, the practice may not be able to administer all the vaccines you need, and you may have to contact one of the nearest Travel Clinics instead:

Please contact the Surgery to order your prescription 7 - 10 days before your medication is required. Order your prescription via the same methods, either by phoning the repeat prescription line on 01437 720644, online or post your repeat slip directly to the surgery.

Did you know that you can nominate your chosen Pharmacy?

You can ask the Surgery to send your prescriptions to one of the Pharmacies below that has a collection service and they will have the medication ready for you to pick-up 7-10 days after your order. Some Community Pharmacies offer home delivery of your medication. This is not an NHS service, is subject to delivery radius and delivery charges may apply.

Boots Pharmacy - Fishguard Boots Pharmacy - Haverfordwest Well Pharmacy – Haverfordwest

If you want all of your prescriptions to go to one of the Community Pharmacies that offer the collection service, you can tell one of the reception team at the Surgery and they will note this in your records so that every prescription goes there directly, this means that you won't need to collect your prescription from the Surgery.

AVIAN INFLUENZA CONFIRMED

Public urged not to handle dead or sick wild birds found in Pembrokeshire due to confirmed Avian Influenza (bird flu) cases.



Hundreds of seabirds washed up on South Pembrokeshire beaches, including guillemots, razorbills, and gannets.

Organizations involved include Pembrokeshire County Council, Pembrokeshire Coast National Park Authority, National Trust Cymru, Wildlife Trust of South and West Wales, and the Welsh Government. The public is advised to keep dogs on leads and provide location details when reporting incidents.

- · Dead birds in public places should be reported by calling 01437 764551 (or out of hours 0345 601 5522) for Pembrokeshire County Council to arrange to collect safely.
- · If you find any sick or injured wild birds (on public or private land), please contact the RSPCA on 0300 1234 999.
- ·Dead birds on private land should be reported to PCC on the numbers above for information gathering purposes but removal will be via DEFRA on 03459 33 55 77 or see https://www.gov.uk/guidance/report-dead-wild-birds

Scrupulous biosecurity is the most effective method of disease control available and all bird keepers should follow enhanced biosecurity measures at all times to prevent the risk of future outbreaks.




