

The last full Council meeting before Christmas saw several important matters decided. Here is how I represented the people of Solva Ward

The first major decision was whether the Presiding Member should receive an extra payment for chairing the Full Council meetings, a task previously undertaken by the Chairman of Council. It was decided to not make a further payment available. I voted against an extra payment

The next major decision was how much to increase the Council House rents. 2 options were available either 5% or 6.7% plus £2 per week in both cases. I voted for the higher amount as I believe Council House rents offer good value for money, less than the private rentals and the more revenue raised would allow for more houses to be built and modernisations to be made to existing properties. The higher rate was passed by 43 votes to 9

Next up was the most controversial item, the setting of the level of Second Homes council tax premium with 200% being proposed. This is the premium added to any property owned by a person but not lived in as their main home. The premium was introduced at 50% in 2017 and for the last 2 years has been 100% in addition to the standard Council tax and now 200% on the table. The Council cannot say what type of property owner was being charged the proposed 200% premium, whether the house was a luxury holiday home or a property to subsidise a local resident's income. I voted against an increase as it was clear to me that some of the losers forced to pay more tax will be local people with a letting property who achieve less than the 182 nights a year letting set by the Welsh Government to be exempt from 2nd homes premium. The increase was passed by 28 votes to 21 and it is almost certain that little of the premium raised will be reinvested in affordable housing

Closely following this was a vote on increasing the Empty homes premium, which was passed with my vote in favour at a 100% at the start of 3 years being empty, 200% at the start of 4 years being empty and 300% at the start of year 5 of being empty. My feeling along with many other Councillors was that empty homes do nothing for the community. The increase was passed by 42 votes to 4

Several other items, questions and Notices of Motion followed, one of which I submitted to assist first-time self-builders and delay any Affordable Housing contribution they were obliged to make until such times as they sold the property

Finally on a personal note, following a hip replacement just before Christmas, I would just like to thank everyone who sent messages of support, it means a lot to me

They cleared the designated 'Discovery Area' ready for it to become a usable space for children to enjoy, and courtesy of Penny Daffron and the Solva Mosaic Artists a stunning addition to our pond area was created, with a mosaic path laid down to reach the pond. It will allow groups of children to carefully access the pond for pond dipping experiences, as well as explain the life cycle of a frog. As you can see from the photos below it is rather beautiful. Many thanks to those who put in such hard work to create such a stunning piece of art.

Also, in October, Eco Dewi appointed Ruth Kitchell as 'Network Development Officer' at Erw Dewi/ Dewi's Acre. Her task is to encourage more of us to get involved in using the community garden, in a variety of different ways. Ruth says, "Please do pop over if you haven't seen the garden, and just have a walk around, or help yourself to some of the produce grown. It is a garden for everyone living on our Peninsular to use and enjoy. FLU VACCINATION PROGRAMME

Our flu vaccination programme for eligible patients is nearing completion at the Surgery – and eligible housebound patients are being contacted by the District Nurses and the Health Board's community vaccination team to arrange vaccination at home.

COVID AUTUMN BOOSTER VACCINATION PROGRAMME:

Our covid autumn booster vaccination programme is well underway, and we anticipate its completion during November 2023. Patients aged Over 65 are being offered their covid booster at the Surgery; eligible patients aged Under 65 are being invited for vaccination at Solva Surgery. Eligible housebound patients are being contacted by the District Nurses and the Health Board's community vaccination team to arrange vaccination at home.

SHINGLES VACCINATION PROGRAMME

Prior to September 2023, shingles vaccinations were available on the NHS for all adults in their 70s – but now, the age you can be vaccinated against shingles has changed and you can be protected from an earlier age. The vaccine is being offered to eligible patients via a phased national programme – the Surgery will contact you to make an appointment when you become eligible.
