Firstly as you may be aware, the St Davids Civic Amenity site that was destined to be closed in the recent PCC budget has had a reprieve. Armed with the 1600 plus signatures collected online by Richie Davies, Solva Community Council Chairman, the 3 local County Councillors met with the Leader, the Cabinet Member for Resident Services and the Head of Waste and the result was a 1-year reprieve but equivalent cost savings have to be made to ensure it has a future.

Next on the 7th of March, we had a full Council Meeting that included the Budget. A whole raft of cuts minus the closure of St Davids CA site and a 16.3% Council Tax increase were introduced by the Cabinet Member for Finance, Cllr Alec Cormack. As soon as he sat down, the Deputy Leader, Cllr Paul Miller stood up and requested that Standing Orders, the rules by which the Council operates be suspended. Once this was voted on and granted, he was able to propose an alternative Budget. Under normal rules, at least 14 days of an alternative budget should have been provided but these rules had been suspended. By using £1.5m worth of reserves, increasing revenues from leisure by £300,000 and stating that a further £1m of savings would be found by the Chief Executive, the CT increase proposed was now 12.5%. Previous advice from Officers was that reserves should not be used. However, the sting in the tail is the expected CT rise for next year is likely to be at least 11.4%. Members were surprised by this proposal and were not given any time to digest the proposal and for this reason, my group including myself voted against this proposal. It still passed by about 5 votes.

Closer to home, I have managed to get the topic of the adoption of Lewes Terrace raised again. This has been an ongoing matter since 2006, and for clarity, is the raised section of roadway frontage from the Royal George to the foot of the slope next to the Memorial. PCC has issued letters to all those with frontages stating that they propose to adopt the roadway and maintain it assuming there are no objections. Most of this land appears to be unregistered. This will provide a safe official walking route from the Royal George to the Memorial and appropriate signage can be erected. Fingers crossed.

As usual, if any resident needs any help in relation to a Council matter, feel free to call me.

The Therapy Hounds visited Solva Care Friday Club again on the 16th of February and brought a beautiful lurcher called Abbie with them. Abbie was living in squalid conditions with other dogs when, by pure chance, two of the dogs (Abbie and another) escaped and were running loose in the streets. Abbie was sadly struck by a car which led to the police attending the scene. The police managed to track down the owner and found the other dog Albus locked in a cupboard with no food, starving and alone, along with other dogs living in equally awful conditions. The police contacted Greyhound Rescue Wales (GRW) and they were both rescued. Abbie has brain damage due to the accident and it was decided that she should be fostered and remain under the medical care of GRW for life. She is now living a happy life in her loving forever foster home. She was a delight to see being fussed by so many people and looking so healthy and happy despite her tragic background.

Fostering is a vital part of rescue and rehoming operations at GRW and they simply wouldn't be able to help the numbers of dogs that they do without the hard work and dedication of their fosterers. Fostering is extremely rewarding, and people foster it for many reasons. It might be you can't commit to a dog longterm, want to gain experience or just want to help out a hound in need. Fostering is basically looking after a dog in your own home for either a short period of time or for a longer period. GRW will provide you with bedding, food, accessories etc., full cover for any vet bills and behavioural assistance and advice to make sure your foster dog has a happy stay in your home.


