COUNCILLOR'S CORNER

Solva



One of the recurring concerns raised by residents in Solva is the speed that traffic passes through the village. Since September 2023 the default 30mph limit dropped to 20mph and in Solva this runs from the bridge by the Smithy to the furthest point of Bro Dawel. Default speed limit means that all roads with streetlights over 650 metres span are 20mph with round enforcement signs at the start and end of that limit. Some residents have suggested that there should be repeated signs and painted reminders on the road but in a 20mph zone legislation does not allow this. Other roads with street lights that are faster than 20mph may well have reminders in the form of small round signs or painted markings.



Recently two officers from the police attended Solva Community Council to discuss, amongst other things, residents' concerns in regards to excessive speed. The first, most basic thing is that residents report to 101 any vehicle that they consider to be driving at an inappropriate speed. Please note the registration number, date, time, location and also a description of vehicle and driver. It has also been suggested that residents may like to be trained to operate speed cameras to provide information to go back to Gosafe via our local PCSO. Anyone interested should contact the Community Council. One problem is, by the nature of the road in Solva, it is hard to safely position

a Camera van that is effective in the vicinity of the Memorial Hall from where most concerns seem to originate. I will continue to monitor the situation.

The issue of the continued provision of the toilet block at the Harbour remains unresolved. I understand that Solva CC is arranging a survey so please do respond. What is clear is that without external funding, PCC are very unlikely to continue to provide this service.

As we are now in autumn, streetlights and working drains are very important. If there are any issues, please can you report via your PCC "My Account" or if that is not possible, contact me and I will report it. New signage has been fitted to the Upper Solva play park asking that dogs are not taken in there as there have been incidents of fouling in there; this seems to have been effective.

In County Hall, I have been busy sitting on Planning, Licensing and Scrutiny Committees and also I have been involved in making recommendations as to how much the Second Homes Council tax should be for the next financial year.

Finally I send my **congratulations** to Gareth and Dawn Evans after they were allocated a bungalow in Bro Dawel. I have been asked many times to assist residents by writing an email of support in their application for housing in Solva. I am happy to do this but it is usually a struggle to achieve due to the huge demand, and

quite often there's criticism that someone from Solva does not get a vacant property. In this case, I am delighted that a couple that have done so much for Solva have been allocated a bungalow in their home village and I am sure that all residents will join me in wishing them a long and happy retirement in their new home.





Help Us Keep Solva's Play Areas and Sports Pitch Clean and Safe

Solva Community Council (SCC) is asking for your support in tackling an ongoing issue of dog fouling in our public spaces, particularly the upper play park and adjacent sports pitch.

Unfortunately, both areas have recently been found contaminated with dog mess. This is not only unpleasant, but also poses serious health risks, especially for children who regularly use these facilities.

To protect our community spaces, SCC has agreed to take the following steps:

- Clear new signage will be installed, making it explicit that dogs are not allowed in play parks at any time.
- CCTV warning signs will also be put up, and access will be monitored.
- On the sports pitch, dogs will still be allowed for now, but only along the edges and *always* on a lead.



Remember to take bags whenever
you go for a walk.
Your dog, your job.

We want to be clear: if this situation doesn't improve, we will have no choice but to ban dogs from the sports pitch completely.

We know the vast majority of dog owners are responsible, and we thank you for helping to keep our parks clean, safe, and enjoyable for everyone.

Let's all do our part to keep Solva's community spaces welcoming and safe!



SERIES OF AUTUMN TOURS AND TALKS IN ST DAVIDS CATHEDRAL LIBRARY

St Davids Cathedral Library is holding a series of Tours and Talks this autumn. The annual Libraries Week at the beginning of October will have a range of interesting Talks and Tours, including revealing new research findings. 2025 is the 150th anniversary of the death of Bishop Connop Thirlwall who oversaw the restoration of the cathedral to the building we know today. The iconic west end of the cathedral is a memorial to Connop Thirlwall and incorporates a statue of him. A new book on his life and work is being researched by Emerita Prof Frances Young and Rev Christopher Cunliffe. On Tuesday 7th October the cathedral will mark the anniversary with a tour, led by Bishop Wyn Evans, of the parts of the cathedral that benefitted from Thirlwall's restoration. In the afternoon Frances Young and Christopher Cunliffe will talk on Thirlwall's wider life and work. Online Tickets can be accessed through the library page on the cathedral website (see link below).

Over the summer many local people, as well as hundreds of visitors, came to the cathedral to see the first Bible in Welsh. This copy was originally given to Westminster Abbey Library by Rev William Morgan in November 1588. This summer was the first time this Bible had been in Wales. On Thursday 9th October there will be a panel discussion session revealing initial joint findings on the 1588 Bible by the Library teams in Westminster Abbey and St Davids Cathedral. 

Manx Shearwaters - these striking black-and-white birds, which nest in burrows on the islands of Skomer, Skokholm, Midland, and Ramsey, embark on an epic migration each autumn - crossing the Atlantic and the equator to spend winter off the coast of South America.

Pembrokeshire plays a vital role in their lifecycle, hosting around 60% of the global breeding population, with Skomer Island alone home to an estimated 350,000 pairs.

However, fledgling Shearwaters often become disoriented by artificial lights on the mainland or boats. Leaving their burrows under the cover of darkness, they can be drawn inland, where they face serious threats from predators and traffic. Without human help, many will not make it back to the sea.

People across the peninsula, including Solva and St Davids, have been helping out rescuing stranded Manx Shearwaters. Sadly, the combination of strong westerlies and light pollution means many more than usual have flown inland rather than heading for Argentina.

So far volunteers have rescued more than 1000 stranded birds from across Pembrokeshire, and especially in hotspots such as Newgale, Broad Haven, the Milford Haven Waterway, and Tenby. Not all the birds stay in Pembrokeshire – they have been rescued from as far afield as Wolverhampton and Lichfield!

Thanks to the swift action of local volunteers and members of the public, these birds were safely released to continue their journey south.

The group has also erected signs at Newgale appealing for drivers to slow down, as so many birds are run over there each year, and slower speeds at night might just help prevent deaths and allow them to be rescued.



October: Embrace the Season of Change





- Find Joy in Simplicity:** "Autumn carries more gold in its pocket than all the other seasons". Find the richness in the season's simple pleasures, like a crisp walk or enjoying the changing colour.

Coastal rocks hold the memory of time—sculpted by tides, marked by elemental forces. Set in Stone reimagines these ancient forms through digital solarization and colour transformation, revealing a hidden spectrum of light and energy within the landscape. Each image in this series shifts its visual spectrum, dissolving the boundaries between reality and abstraction. The altered hues and tones echo the unseen forces that have shaped these stones over millennia—weathering, erosion, and the ceaseless motion of the sea.

Ty Hir Craft, consisting of Ty Hir Turning and Green Bean Bags, embraces a sustainable design approach using reclaimed, recycled, and locally sourced materials. Ty Hir Turning transforms locally found wood, including wood from ash dieback management, into vibrant, decorative pieces, giving new life to trees that are no longer viable. Green Bean Bags repurposes recycled coffee bean sacks, combining them with designer and vintage fabrics to create unique, colourful bags. This exhibition highlights their innovative approach to sustainability through craftsmanship.
